INTRODUCTION



ASSEMBLY

- 1. Remove all components from the carrying case.
- Assemble the support feet and support legs—simply slip the Support Legs into the open part of the "T" connector.
- 3. Assemble the Top Supports. This is a threaded connection.

- 4. Slip each end into the open "elbows" of the Support Legs.
- Install the fabric shield by sliding it over the assembly (like putting on a pillow case).
- 6. Assembly is now complete. If you plan to use more than one kit, follow Steps 1-5 above, and the connect the two (or three) assemblies using the plastic clips by snapping them onto the Support Legs.

MAINTENANCE

The only maintenance required is to keep all of the components clean by wiping them down with a damp cloth or paper towel. The fabric cover is machine washable on a gentle cycle.
